






LEFT HAND

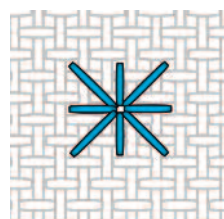
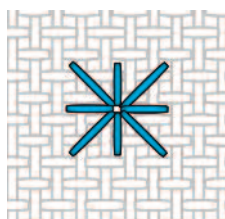
ALGERIAN EYELET STITCH

This stitch is usually worked by counting threads on an evenweave fabric, but can be worked on any fabric.


Mark a square five holes across and five holes down; Work from the top corner hole across alternate holes (three stitches in each side of the square)


1. Bring the thread up at **a**. Take the thread down into the centre hole, and bring it up at **b**.
2. Take the thread down into the centre hole, then back up at **c**.
3. Continue working around the square, taking the thread down in the centre at every stitch. Keep the tension even as you work.


To join a new thread: Take the thread down at the centre and finish off at the back of the work. Bring a new thread up at the next point of the square and continue stitching.





RIGHT HAND
