


QUEEN STITCH

This stitch is usually worked by counting threads on canvas or an evenweave fabric, but can be worked on any fabric.

It can be worked as a single stitch or in multiples side by side, as a fill stitch. Use it upright, or turn work and use it on the diagonal.


- **1.** Bring the thread up at **a**. Count holes vertically and take the thread down at the fourth hole, at **b**, keeping the thread looped slightly; bring the thread up two holes down and two holes across, at **c**, keeping the needle over the looped thread.
- **2.** Take the thread across one hole to the right (RH), or left (LH), at **d.** Bring the thread back up at **a**.
- **3.** Take the thread down at **b**, keeping the thread looped slightly; bring the thread up two holes down, at **e**, keeping the needle over the looped thread.
- 4. Take the thread back down at d. Bring it back up at a.
- **5.** Repeat **Steps 3 and 4** twice more, moving the central stitch across by one hole each time.

To join a new thread: Take the thread as indicated at the step being worked. Finish off at the back of the work. Bring a new thread up where the step being worked indicates, and
